



We will do even more to facilitate the networks, groups and individuals who do the on-the-ground work to improve landscapes. By helping them with the processes, knowledge and skills they need, we can make things easier for them and help them to be more effective.

#### WE'LL DO THIS BY

#### Enhancing the organisational capacity of our networks and groups

We'll help to strengthen the organisational and governance capacities of groups and networks, so they can effectively deliver strong landcare outcomes and improve retention and recruitment of volunteers.

#### Building the skills and knowledge of landcarers

We'll invest in ways to build the skills and knowledge of landcarers in how to work together, as well as practical on-the-ground ways to tackle climate change, food security and biodiversity loss, and build community resilience.

#### Unlocking the resources that landcare networks and groups need to thrive

To support our networks and groups to grow and flourish, we will work with them to unlock the resources they need - paid and unpaid. This includes leveraging investment and delivering support.



## WHAT THIS MAY LOOK LIKE

You'll be seeing more work like our Advancing Landcare Program which is delivering tailored training and activities that meet the needs of volunteers and those in professional landcare roles.



We help individuals and groups work together to protect and enhance the natural environment in Victoria more effectively than if they were doing it alone. This allows for cooperative, multidisciplinary approaches to caring for the land. It also amplifies our impact beyond our membership and our existing areas of expertise.

#### WE'LL DO THIS BY

#### Collaborating to deliver meaningful projects at scale

By resourcing grassroots landcare, we allow individuals and groups to partner to deliver impactful projects that balance productivity and biodiversity.

#### Partnering to ensure landcarers have access to the best tools and resources

By partnering with government, universities, research organisations and other allied stakeholders, we will support landcarers to use the best tools and resources that underpin biodiverse and productive landscapes.

#### Learning from and working with First Nations groups and individuals

First Nations groups and individuals hold incredible knowledge and have a special place in our communities. We will find opportunities to learn from them and work together to restore our natural environment.

#### WHAT THIS MAY LOOK LIKE

We'll be rolling out new programs, similar to our New Futures for Victorian Landcare project, which is supporting the participation of the landcare community in emerging green investment markets, and the Carbon Farming Outreach Program, which is helping assist Victorian farmers to understand their emissions and the benefits of carbon farming. We will be supporting peerto-peer learning and mentoring, and partnerships that ensure the Victorian landcare movement can deliver on the priorities in the Landcare Plan for Victoria (2022-2033).



Our plan



We provide a strong voice on behalf of landcarers in Victoria to influence decision makers, funders and the broader public. We advocate to allow individuals and groups to care for the land and proudly share all they do. Over time, we will help communities to create a balance between sustainable agriculture, land management practices, economics and ecology.



#### WE'LL DO THIS BY

#### Representing and advocating on behalf of landcarers

We are uniquely placed to provide landcarers with a compelling voice in the media, and with government at all levels. We will do this by listening carefully to what landcarers are telling us and representing their needs publicly and privately.

#### Demonstrating the value that landcare delivers

We'll be working hard to gather the data and stories that show funders, government and others the true value of the work that landcare provides, its return on investment and its critical role enhancing the state's environment.

#### Showing how great landcare is

We will recognise and celebrate the achievements of the incredible people in our movement and use their stories to inspire others to get involved.

### WHAT THIS MAY LOOK LIKE

You'll see us meeting with MPs in Parliament and hosting Parliamentary Friends of Landcare events. We will be working collaboratively with key landcare stakeholders to measure the impact of our work and sharing inspiring landcare stories in our own publications as well as in the media.





We're setting a bold and ambitious Strategic Plan, and Landcare Victoria must have strong foundations to deliver on it.

Landcare Victoria has the resourcing, governance, people and culture it needs to deliver its work.

This means we'll be working hard to ensuring we have the resources - financial and otherwise – to adequately support our organisation and the work we do with our network.
